How are deep bites best rehabilitated?

How should dentitions with extensive wear be treated to minimize the risk of failure?

How "overdrilled" can a dentition be, and one may still dare to make a tooth supported restoration?

The answers to these questions are not found in clinical studies. Instead, we have to rely on the presentation of clinical cases and on well-tried experience.

The book Prosthetic Treatment in the Compromised Dentition demonstrates in text and with approximately 400 colour photographs directly applicable treatment strategies that will ensure a stable and harmonious function for the dentition, and the longest possible longevity of prosthetic restorations.

The presented strategies have equal validity for tooth and implant supported prosthetic restorations and for fixed and removable prostheses. Because even if dental materials and methods may change over time, the masticatory apparatus still works according to the same principles as ever.
